## **Getting Ready for a Marin Halloween**

### **Open Space Event: The Raptors of Hawk Hill**

Wednesday, October 14th from 10:00am to 2:00pm.

Every year, thousands of raptors move down the pacific coast as they search for wintering sites as far away as South America. We'll learn to identify these birds and discuss what has been learned about the lives of these amazing predators. Assistant Naturalist Shannon Burke, who has been a Hawkwatch volunteer for nine years will describe the migration and discuss identification of the species seen here. Meet at the observation area on Hawk Hill. Take the Golden Gate National Recreation Area/Sausalito exit off southbound Hwy 101, turn left at the stop sign, turn right on Conzelman Rd, and follow to the top of the hill (you will see a sign for Hawk Hill). Park alongside the road before it becomes one way and then walk up the west side of the hill past the locked gate.

### **Goblin Jamboree Fundraiser 2009**

Saturday, October 17th and Sunday, October 18th from 10:00am to 4:00pm.

Children and their families are invited to come in costume and explore the Bay Area Discovery Museum, transformed into a haunted wonderland complete with games, attractions and live entertainment. Ride a train and ponies, enroll in the witches' school, visit the petting zoo and enjoy a full brew of games, activities and live entertainment.

### **The State of our California Parks**

Governor Schwarzenegger just released a statement that no California state park will be closed in the 2009/2010 fiscal year (ending June 30, 2010). Through several budgeting maneuvers and temporary "reallocations" of funds, the line was held against closing any state park. For the past several months the Department of Parks and Recreation has struggled over which parks (100+) to close and how to close them.

The California Travel Industry Association (CalTIA) was a major player in mobilizing efforts to protect the parks realizing the impact such closures would have on the number of visitors to California and the effect on surrounding businesses. CalTIA became an influential voice during each hearing and meeting emphasizing the importance the state parks have on California's tourism industry, the fourth largest contributor to the state's economy. According to the California Travel and Tourism Commission (CTTC), more than 15 million visitors visited a California state or national park, generating approximately \$3.7 billion in local economic activity. Not surprisingly, 47% of international travelers visited a park during 2008. Travelers who also stayed in local hotels, frequented local restaurants and enjoyed the local entertainment.

While California continues to weather the economic downturn and a very troubled budget, it is imperative that we work together to identify alternative funding sources for our state parks. In the next several months, expect to see another push for a \$15.00 increase in the state's Vehicle License Fee that would be dedicated to the funding of state parks. The fee would also act as an "All Access Pass" allowing any automobile with a California license plate into any state park for free. The "All Access Pass" is most likely to be placed on the state-wide November 2nd General Election ballot. As a ballot measure it would only require 51% support for passage as opposed to the harder to obtain 2/3rds support it requires in the Legislature.
