

**FILM PERMIT REGULATIONS
MARIN COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS**

1. **This information sheet pertains to Department of Public Works (DPW) permits for filming on County-maintained roads. For other County filming permits:** Contact Parks & Open Space at (415) 499-6387 for filming at County Parks; contact the Administrator's Office at (415) 499-6538 for filming with helicopters. The cost of a Helicopter Permit is \$250 per day. Contact Community Development Agency Code Enforcement, Christy Stanley at (415) 499-7875 for filming at the County Civic Center and other County owned or leased facilities.
2. **DPW Permits and Fees:** A Film and Encroachment Permit must be obtained from DPW for filming on County roads. Film permit applications must be submitted a minimum of three days in advance of requested dates of filming. The filming fee is \$500 per day plus a one-time encroachment fee of \$135.

3. **Highway Patrol Required:** When filming on County roads, traffic control must be provided by the California Highway Patrol (CHP). The film company must contract for these services directly with the CHP and pay any necessary fees.

4. **Insurance:** The filming company must furnish insurance coverage for liability, bodily injury and property damage in an amount not less than \$1,000,000, naming the County of Marin as additional insured. This amount may be increased if dictated by special circumstances.
5. **Time Restrictions:** Filming on the following roads is not allowed on weekdays between 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. and between 3:30 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.: Gate 6 Road, Lucas Valley Road, Nicasio Valley Road, Novato Boulevard, Fallon Rd., Panoramic Highway, Paradise Drive, Platform Bridge Road, Pt. Reyes-Petaluma Road, Sir Francis Drake Boulevard. Special signing is required for filming on Bear Valley Road during the above hours. Time constraints may be applied to other roads under special circumstances. No filming is allowed during weekends on Bear Valley Rd., Pierce Pt. Rd., and Sir Francis Drake Blvd. past Inverness.
6. **Special arrangements must be made when filming at the following locations:** The village areas of Tomales, Pt. Reyes Station, or Nicasio; within six miles of Marshall on Marshall-Petaluma Road; on Greensburg or Whiteplains; in Kent Woodlands; in other densely populated areas. Local contact persons are:

7. **Wetting of the roadway** is allowed only on condition that the CHP remains onsite until they deem the road safe for passage. Wetting of the road is not allowed if freezing temperatures are imminent.
8. **Traffic and private property:** The filming company must take all necessary measures to insure that the filming activities do not unreasonably impede the flow of vehicular traffic, restrict access to public or private property, or damage public or private property.
9. **Refunds:** If the permit is cancelled, \$70.00 will be refunded on the encroachment permit and all but \$100.00 on the film permit, subject to verification of cancellation from the California Highway Patrol.

STANDARD CONDITIONS FOR FILMING ON COUNTY ROADS

1. Traffic control shall be approved and carried out by the California Highway Patrol.
2. Two lanes of traffic shall be kept open at all times except for short intervals not to exceed three minutes.
3. Access for ranchers and farmers to their agricultural lands shall be maintained at all times.
4. Standard traffic signs should be erected at each end of the project and they should consist of C9R-1 (Flagman Ahead) and C227 (Men and Equipment): these signs to be supplied by the film producers.
5. There shall be a set of short wave radios at the site for traffic control.
6. This permit allows no waiver of the California Vehicle Code or Marin County Code Title 15, Traffic.
7. This permit is for filming only and the only props allowed are cars. No special effects are allowed unless specifically permitted below.
8. All equipment, props, debris, litter, etc., shall be removed at the end of the last day of filming.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. WETTING OF THE ROADWAY: Allowed ONLY upon condition that the California Highway Patrol remains onsite until they deem the roadway safe for passage of vehicles. Wetting of the roadway is NOT allowed if freezing temperatures are imminent.
2. RESTRICTED FILMING HOURS: Filming on the following roads is not allowed between 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. and between 3:30 p.m. and 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday:

Gate 6 Road
Bear Valley Road
Fallon – Two Rock Road
Lucas Valley Road
Nicasio Valley Road
Novato Boulevard
Panoramic Highway
Paradise Drive
Platform Bridge Road
Pt. Reyes-Petaluma Road
Sir Francis Drake Blvd. between San Rafael and Inverness

Filming on the following roads is not allowed on the weekends:

Bear Valley Road
Pierce Point Road
Sir Francis Drake Blvd. (entire length)
